*NOTE: to have got = to have
He hasn't got any friends =
He has no friends.*



Look at this man. His name is Brian Brown. He's from Oxford. He's an engineer. He's got a good job. He's got a small car. He hasn't got a big house. He lives in a flat. He's got a wife, but he hasn't got any children. His life is O.K.

NOTE: He's an engineer. (He is engineer.)

TO LIVE

I ...*live*... in Berlin.

You in a modern house.

He ...*lives*... abroad.

She in San Francisco.

We in Denmark.

Youin a nice town.

They at Baker Street.

HAVE NOT

I ...*haven't*... got a car.

Yougot a bad job.

Hegot many friends.

She*hasn't*.... got anything.

Wegot any children.

You got any money.

Theygot a big house.

(American English: I don't have any kids. She doesn't have a good job.)
