In English, there is only one conjugation feature: in the third person singular present tense, the conjugated verb always has an *-s*.  
 (Exceptions are some auxiliary verbs such as **can** or **must**, which do not have an *-s*).  
 If the verb ends in *-o*, an *e* is inserted in between: *does*, *goes*.
