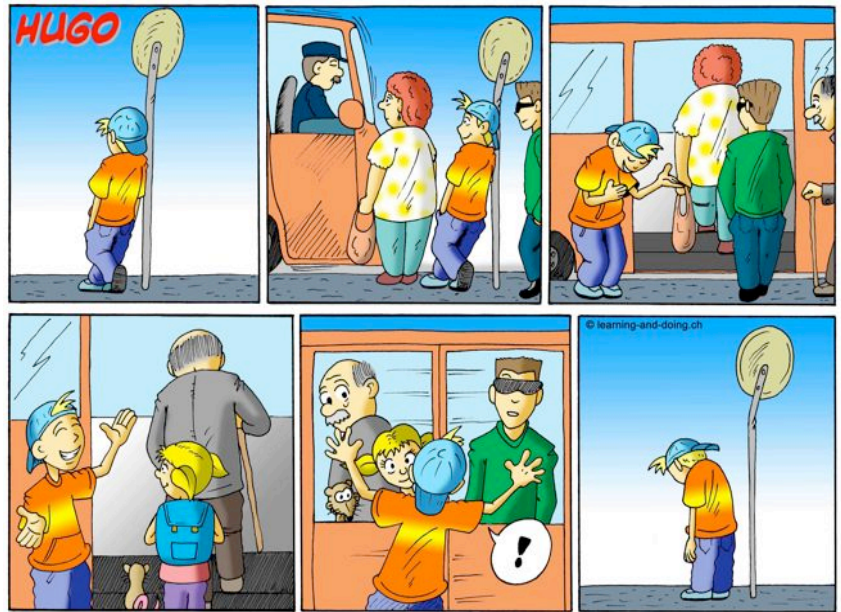


It's a quarter past two.

 Some other people are waiting, too.
 At twenty past two the bus comes.
 The doors open.
 Hugo is always polite.
 He lets others get on the bus first.
 Suddenly the doors close.
 Hugo's still outside the bus.
 Hugo shouts: Stop!
 But the driver doesn't hear.
 The bus is leaving.
 Hugo isn't on the bus.
 He must wait for the next bus.



Find the opposites:

- The weather is **bad**. ...*nice*.....
- The bus **leaves**.
- Hugo is **inside**.
- He is **always** kind.
- The door **opens**.
- Hugo is **last**.

Write in the negative:

- He's waiting for the bus. ...*He isn't waiting for the bus.*
- The people are waiting.
- Hugo feels good.
- Hugo is inside the bus.
- He's shouting.
- The driver can hear him.
- The weather is bad.
- The doors shut.
- The bus will arrive soon. (will not -> won't)
- Hugo gets into the bus.
- Hugo is very polite.
- He isn't going to see his friends.

NEGATIVE SENTENCES:
 WITH AN AUXILIARY VERB:
 Hugo is waiting for the bus.
Hugo isn't waiting for the bus.
 The driver can hear him.
The driver can't hear him.
 I'll be late.
I won't be late.

WITH A FULL VERB WE USE „DO“:
 The doors shut.
The doors don't shut.
 The door opens.
The door doesn't open.
 The bus comes.
The bus doesn't come.
 The people wait for the bus.
The people don't wait for the bus.
